#### The Grand Almoner's Message



I am very excited to share with you that I have worked with our staff at the Alzheimers Association, and our 2018-2019 Research Donations will be designated for use by the Wake Forest University School of

Medicine in their U.S. POINTER research study. This is a U.S.-based study seeking ways to protect brain health through lifestyle intervention to reduce risk. The basis of the study is derived from new research that suggests that making multiple healthy lifestyle choices, including healthy diet, not smoking, regular exercise, and a regimen of cognitive stimulation may reduce the risk of cognitive decline and dementia. randomized and controlled trial will evaluate lifestyle whether interventions that simultaneously target the risk factors can cognitive function in participants, aged 60-79, who are at increased risk for cognitive decline. This program was specifically selected because it is budgeted for and managed by U.S. physicians within the Mid-Atlantic United States and it is the closest large-grant program to our home area. The clinical trials are getting ready to begin, and they require a great deal of financial support. We had to have a minimum of \$10,000 in donations to qualify as a grant partner to support this objective and thanks to

your efforts, we have surpassed that threshold. This research will also directly impact clinicians in North Carolina and Virginia. The group we are supporting is led by Dr. Laura Baker. We now have a defined program to rally behind and to discuss when we talk about Research! At the end of the year, we will evaluate the progress and success of the U.S. POINTER program and decide from there if it will be our research donation effort for 2019-2020. This study is to continue into 2021. If you have made recent donations, please make sure you send our Grand Secretary receipts with your Chapter and District numbers on them so that we can account for your charity. Walk Captains, make sure you send in copies of your walk forms once your walks are completed. Remember that if you write on your check memo "Alzheimer's Research" it is going to our new U.S. POINTER study grant and if you memo your check "Alzheimer's Walk" or "Walk Donation", it is going to the Walk to End Alzheimer's Program in your local area.
