

Greetings to all and hope you are enjoying the few days left of summer.

As we approach November, I hope you are making plans on attending the Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons in Virginia in Williamsburg.

For this edition of the Keystone, I thought about writing on why we should be a Royal Arch Mason. In researching this idea, I found some interesting thoughts and thought it worthwhile in discussing this topic. It is always good to refresh our memory so we can be prepared to relay this information to a Blue Lodge Brother interested in the Royal Arch.

It is not doubt that the York Rite increases and simplifies the Blue Lodge teachings. In the Blue Lodge, we are taught about the building, completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple. As we advance in the Royal Arch, we are taught about the destruction of the with its importance and implication to Masonry.

In the Blue Lodge we are taught about the wages paid by the Senior Warden and it is also explained to us. But in the Chapter, we learn what the wages are and how they are to be distributed.

In the Past Master's Degree, we are taught the lesson of consensus among the Companions. This degree is exemplified to continue its ancient custom and is a requirement to being exalted a Royal Arch Mason.

The Most Excellent Master Degree teaches us to exercise respect as it is centered on the dedication of the completion of the Temple. It finalizes the symbolic lessons that are brought to our

attention in the Mark Master Degree. With the completion of King Solomon's Temple, an enlightening mystery is disclosed to us.

We finally reach the pinnacle in the Royal Arch Degree as it completes the story of Jewish history during some of its somber hours. It informs us of when Jerusalem and the Holy Temple are destroyed, and their people being held captive as slaves in Babylon. They are eventually set free to return home and engage in the noble and glorious work of rebuilding the city and Temple of God.

There is much more information on the Royal Arch which we need to learn so to

attract our Blue Lodge Brothers in becoming a member or the Royal Arch. The more you know about the Royal Arch, the better you are able to explain to a Brother what he can expect to gain by petitioning the Chapter.

#### Fredericksburg Royal Arch No 23

I love Royal Arch Masonry and becoming the High Priest of Fredericksburg's historic Chapter was a very great honor for me. I also love ritual so, as the High Priest, one of my objectives was to polish our ritual and to become conversant with all of the degrees. We were blessed with an influx of candidates and the idea evolved that we would confer all of the degrees ourselves for the first time in many years.

Fredericksburg has the honor of having the first recorded conferral of the Royal Arch Degree on December 22, 1753 but, in recent years, it has not been able to dos so. We proceeded to confer degrees, add candidates, confer the same degrees again to get all the candidates on an equal footing with the Royal Arch as our ultimate goal.

We finally got everybody synched up for the Select and Royal Master Degree and conferred that on six candidates - we were nicely on track. Our Grand Master of the third veil, Excellent Michael Brennen did a superlative job conferring the Most Excellent Master the degree on remaining five candidates and we focused on the Royal Arch Degree. Getting one to "Ask 1 2 B 1" - How do we do it? Believe it or Not (Ripley said that - not me) there are many good men

out there who would make a wonderful Freemason. I know that we as Masons are not supposed to ask anyone to join our fraternity. It must be of someone's own free will and accord. However, there is a way to let a profane know that in order to become one of us he must first "Ask 1 in order to be 1." I don't know

Those who are not Masons just don't realize what they are missing out on. What I often do when I have a conversation with someone I feel in my heart would make a good Mason is to say things like - "You know, you'd sure make a good Mason" or, "It's people like you that make a fraternity like Freemasonry keep its good name." You might also mention some famous names of Freemasons that everyone knows - like the Father of our Country and first president of the United States, George Washington; The founder of St. Jude's Hospital - Danny Thomas; Comedian Red Skelton; Colonel Sanders; of Kentucky Fried Chicken - Ernest Borgnine; John Wayne; and frontiersman, soldier, politician, congressman, and prolific storyteller, Davy Crockett. This list goes on and on.

Today there are over 2 million Freemasons in the United States with lodges found in almost every community. Worldwide our membership is around 6 million.

If your approach to explaining what our Institution is all about, there is an excellent chance your friend will want to know more, all hopefully leading to those magic words.
