

Our new Grand Secretary is Right Excellent Wayne H. Anderson, a well-known figure in Tidewater Masonry. Andy, as he is known, was made a Royal Arch Mason in Great Bridge Chapter No. 82 in 1989, served as its High Priest in 1992-1993, and then joined Mt. Horeb Chapter No. 11, serving as its Secretary since 2001. He was appointed as District Deputy Grand High Priest in 2006.

Companion Anderson was raised a Master Mason in Great Bridge Lodge No. 257, serving as its Master in 1994. Quickly becoming an experienced ritualist, he served on the Grand Lodge Committee on Work from 1994 to 2007. While serving on the Committee, he was appointed Grand Pursuivant in 1997, and served as Master of Portsmouth Naval Lodge No. 100 in 2001 and Ivor Lodge No. 291 in 2002. He also was named District Deputy Grand Master for the 31st Masonic District in 2003.

In his spare time, you can usually find Andy at the Portsmouth Scottish Rite Valley, where he served as Venerable Master in 2003 and as its General Secretary since 2004. He was coroneted a 33^o Mason in 2001.

We welcome Companion Anderson as the latest of the outstanding Royal Arch Masons who have occupied the position once held by our most revered Companion, Right Excellent John Dove. We look forward to the good work you will do on our behalf!

Make sure you take along some handouts explaining the degrees conferred by the Royal Arch and always have petitions readily available. The Grand Chapter is an excellent source for this type of information. Make it a point to visit the Grand Royal Arch Chapter website and click on Education. Most Excellent Don McAndrews has produced a Royal Arch Membership Video that goes into detail about our Fraternity. Arm yourself with this knowledge before undertaking visitations to talk about the Royal Arch. And by all means recommend it to those considering becoming a Companion. Navigating the internet is the speediest way to do research. You may want to check out the California York Rite website for their Royal Arch information. Now that you have read this article and its attachments - make it your priority to apply the three D's and spread the word: **The Red Coats are coming to a Blue Lodge near you.**

He and the High Priest of Columbia Chapter DC were school chums. Mt. Ex. Fuller made a visit to Columbia Chapter and in June 1961 the High Priest made a visit to Arlington Chapter No. 35 and the event has continued to this day. Mt. Ex. George D. "King Fish" Stevens was the one that kept the annual event going until his death."

The phrase "I will do answer make... if within the length of my cable tow," should be in the hearts of all Master Masons and refer not only to the call for assistance from

another Lodge, but for all Masonic bodies, and include the Royal Arch Chapter as well. With membership waning and those who have memorized the ritual and work within the Royal Arch being few and far between, obtaining the Degrees as conferred in the Royal Arch can be burdensome for the local Chapters. Thankfully, some good Companions from O'Keefe Royal Arch Chapter #26 in Tazewell, VA, along with Companions from other Chapters in the 12th and surrounding districts, have created a traveling "Degree Team" to assist those Chapters in need of conferring the degrees on newly elected candidates. They have committed themselves to learning the ritual and work in each individual degree as to be able to better confer them when requested. These Companions have already traveled to Castlewood, VA and other Royal Arch Chapters in Southwest Virginia to bring other Brothers to "more light" in Masonry.
