

the Grand Chapter's relationship with the Alzheimer's Association, having selected it



as the Grand Chapter's philanthropy of choice during his year in the Grand East in 2001. The jewel was co-designed by Right Excellent Jason Curtis Trenary, Grand Almoner of Virginia, and Most Illustrious John Bridegroom, Past Grand Master of Cryptic Masons

in Indiana. To obtain the jewel, Companions must personally dedicate a \$500 donation specifically for the purpose of the jewel, to Alzheimer's Disease Research. The humble goal in mind is twofold, to continue Most Excellent Burcham's legacy of supporting the Alzheimer's Association and to remember the memory and legacy of our beloved Companion. This Jewel can be worn on all clothing except the Knight Templar Uniform. It's unique and detailed and a true memento in memory of our late Brother. Design Symbolism (per Jake Trenary):

- The White Ribbon - Signifying purity of heart and rectitude of conduct
- JGB – The initials of our departed Companion
- The Three Stars – Representing the three Grand Offices in the York Rite bodies that he held in his lifetime: Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Most Illustrious Grand Master, and Right Eminent Grand Commander.

- Blue, Purple, Red, and White on the Ribbon Pin – Signifying his commitment to the York Rite Bodies of Freemasonry: The Blue Lodge, Chapter, Cryptic Council, and Commandery.

- The Square on the Medal Face – Symbolizing productive leadership and virtue toward all mankind.

- The pillars of Jachin and Boaz – A double symbolism to his initials (“JB”), as they were featured in some fashion on all of his personal Masonic pins in his lifetime. They also represent strength, establishment, and the universality of Freemasonry.

- The Gold Heart – Our continued love and memory for departed brother recognized in charity and philanthropy toward others.

- The Herald Angel with the Trumpet – A valued life that was called home by God to ascend to heaven too soon before his work was complete here on Earth.

- The Triple Tau – The Royal Arch Symbol for the Christian Holy Trinity: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- The Two Deltas – The intimate connection between the Christian Holy Trinity, the Masonic concepts of wisdom, strength and beauty, and the Christian phases of a worthy man's life including life, death, and resurrection.

- The Field of Blue – The concepts of serenity, stability, inspiration, reliability, and calm. The qualities that he perpetuated as a leader in our great Fraternity.

The Grand Almoner's Message

Companions All:



Our 2019-2020 Philanthropy effort stands at \$10,629 at the time of this writing. Momentum is steadily increasing, and we will hopefully get back in stride with our goals with the return of our Grand

High Priest's Official Visits next week. We are just over the halfway point of the Capitular year, and the last four months have been both extraordinary and challenging times. As good men and Freemasons, we must persevere in our activity and service as we always have throughout history. I must remind each of you that one of our most excellent tenets remains charity toward all mankind, and you may still be the difference in someone's life through your community service and monetary donations, directly or indirectly. The Covid-19 virus outbreak has only made it more difficult for those suffering Alzheimer's Disease to seek and find assistance, treatment, and support. We must continue to do our part to help those who are less fortunate than us.

The Year 2020 by the Numbers

The Alzheimer's Association recently released new Alzheimer's Disease figures for 2020 and these numbers are staggering.

1. Between 2000 and 2018, deaths attributed to Alzheimer's Disease have increased 146%.
2. More than 5,000,000 Americans are now living with Alzheimer's Disease today.
3. More than 16,000,000 Americans

provide unpaid care for those living with Alzheimer's or other forms of dementia.

4. In 2020, Alzheimer's Disease and other forms of dementia will cost our country \$305,000,000,000 (305 Billion Dollars). By 2050, that number is expected to rise to \$1,100,000,000,000 (1.1 Trillion Dollars).

5. Alzheimer's Disease now kills more Americans annually than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined.

The Mission Continues

The mission of the Alzheimer's Association remains to lead the way toward ending Alzheimer's Disease and all other dementia by accelerating global research, driving risk reduction and early detection, and maximizing quality care and support. As Royal Arch Masons in the Commonwealth of Virginia, we are a proud partner in assisting in this just cause.

Updates on Public Policy

In March 2020, the Alzheimer's Association's AIM (Alzheimer's Impact Movement) public policy advocate program successfully lobbied Congress to pass the Supporting Older Americans Act of 2020, which reauthorized the Older Americans Act (OAA) and includes new key provisions of the Younger-Onset Alzheimer's Disease Act. In short, this program ensures that Americans living with dementia will be guaranteed access to affordable brain health services regardless of age. The legislation allows individuals who are under the age of 60 that are diagnosed with younger-onset Alzheimer's or dementia to access the OAA's support programs. These services include organizing and delivering nutrition programs, in-home care services, transportation to and from medical facilities,

legal services, abuse prevention, and caregiver support.

The AIM program also successfully secured historic Federal funding for Alzheimer's research at the National Institutes of Health including a \$425 million dollar increase in 2019. Annual NIH research funding dedicated to Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia is now at roughly \$2.8 billion annually.

Grand High Priest Decision on Reopening Royal Arch Chapters in Virginia

On June 5, Virginia entered the second phase of the “Virginia Forward” reopening plan (Executive Order 65). Accordingly, effective July 1, (subject to adjustment), Chapters holden under the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons in Virginia may resume their regularly scheduled stated convocations in compliance with section 97 of the Digest of the Laws, Rules and Regulations. Until September 1, 2020 (subject to extension if necessary), the High Priest has the prerogative not to hold a stated convocation if he believes such action is in the best interest of preserving the health and safety of the members of the Chapter or if the Chapter is unable to abide by the protocols set forth herein. Should the High Priest choose to exercise this option, he must promptly communicate his decision to his District Deputy Grand High Priest who will, in turn, notify the Administrative Assistant to the Grand High Priest and the Grand Secretary. No dispensation is required. Until further notice, no called or stated convocations for the purpose of conferring any of the Degrees as conferred in the Chapter shall be held in any Chapter holden under this Grand Chapter. A plan regarding the conferral of the Degrees will be forthcoming. More information, including the Grand Lecturer's adjustments to the ritual of opening, closing, and balloting, can be found in his June 15 letter on Reopening Royal Arch Chapters in Virginia.

Now that they are completed, prints will be sold to raise funds for the MAHOVA Memory Care Unit. To this end, Right Excellent Chapman is developing a marketing strategy for the fall of 2020.
