
generosity in contributing to this worthy cause. I am sure there will be additional

The York Rite Leadership organization is a Center of Excellence that delivers executive-class leadership training and coaching to all masonic leaders wheresoever dispersed. The current York Rite Leadership Training Program consists of three welldeveloped courses that are designed to give you the skills to be a better leader of yourself and others.

The three courses are:

100 – Personal Effectiveness

200 - Group Dynamics

400 – Influential Communication

These courses may be attended online (the x01 class) or in person (the x02

class). The course is provided in person each year in the Washington, D.C. area in conjunction with the Mid-Atlantic Department Conference (MADC). Any member of the Masonic family may participate. We do ask that the youth be mature. For quidance, а young gentleman or lady who is between 14 and 18 and has a mature outlook, may be admitted. 

TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY COME GREETINGS:

Know you that I, Hafford Lee Arritt, Jr., by the power in me vested as Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons in Virginia, do grant unto

ALL ROYAL ARCH CHAPTERS IN THE GRAND JURISDICTION OF VIRGINIA

THIS DISPENSATION

To present their balloted Candidates at the Multi-State Jurisdictional Festival to be held under the auspices of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons in Maryland, located at 304 International Circle, Cockeysville, Maryland 21303, on Saturday, October 14, 2023, at 9:00 AM for the purpose receiving the Capitular Degrees as conferred at the Festival. Registration will begin at 8:00 AM. The four Capitular Degrees of Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master, and the Royal Arch Degrees will be conferred by the sister Jurisdictions of Virginia, Delaware, Maryland, and the District of Columbia upon the Candidates of all four Jurisdictions. There will be no Balloting for Virginia Candidates at this Festival. Each Chapter with Candidate(s) must furnish a letter from their Chapter verifying that their Candidate(s) has/have been elected to receive the degrees and all fees are paid. The letter is to be signed by the High Priest and Secretary and sealed with the Chapter Seal. The Chapter will furnish a mark sheet for each Candidate. All Candidates must be accompanied by a member of the Chapter that he petitioned, or he will not be allowed to receive the Degrees at the Festival. The Subordinate Chapter Secretary must notify the Grand Secretary of any Candidates being taken to the Festival ten days prior to the Festival date. Chapters may then accept such Candidates into membership only after they have received the Select and Royal Master Degrees, also having received the High Priest, King, and Scribe Lectures, within Ninety (90) days of the Festival. The date of record for the Candidates will be when they have received the Select and Royal Master Degrees. The Chapter Secretary must furnish in a monthly activity

report the dates of each degree when the Candidate(s) has/have completed the requirements for this Festival.
