
# GRAND HIGH PRIEST/ MOST ILLUSTRIOUS GRAND MASTER'S MESSAGE



#### District No. 15

This month, I would like to comment on a recent seminar following our Grand High Priest's theme of recruiting. A York Rite Seminar was held at Unity Lodge in Front Royal, Virginia. Twenty Companions and Brothers attended. The purpose of the Seminar was to acquaint Brothers interested in Joining a Royal Arch Chapter and a Commandery of Knight Templars. There were 20 Brothers and Companions present to witness the talks.

The Seminar was master-minded by Excellent Companion Edward Tooma, PHP of Shenandoah RAC No. 17, who invited the Eminent Grand Commander Dennis M. Haas, PDDGHP to address the Brothers assembled about joining the Commandery of Knight Templars. The Speakers of the day included: Rt. Ex. Alan Spear PDDGHP, Rt. Ex. Jake Trenary PDDGHP/Grand Sword Bearer of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Virginia and Ex. Companion Edward Tooma PHP of Shenandoah RAC No. 17. The idea of a seminar like the one held in Capitular District 15, is noted below and would be worth consideration elsewhere in Virginia. It

never hurts to try. Getting one new member is better than none.

# A snapshot of Ex. Companion Tooma's remarks are noted below"

"I still remember how excited I was 14 years ago when I took all my degrees in Fredericksburg, and I know you'll feel just as I did should you decide to take the First Best Step to more Masonic Light in Freemasonry. If you have been giving any thought to gaining more light in Masonry, I'd like to be the one who opens that door. "The Best First Step to More Light" would be for your consideration in becoming a Royal Arch Mason. Chapters are always looking for new companions. You notice I said Companions and not Brothers. I also mentioned a Chapter and not a Lodge. Why do Royal Arch Masons call its members Companions? When you combine two Latin words together you have "cum-panis", or Companion, who is someone with whom you shared your bread and could be trusted with your life. Companion is the apt description of a member of the Royal Arch, just as Brother is to the Craft Lodge. Royal Arch Masons call their meeting place a Chapter. Fellow Master Masons, let me ask you a question. Are you in possession of all the light, rights, and benefits of a Master Mason as understood by our ancient Brethren? You are not! Not until you are Exalted to the degree of the Holy Royal Arch. The Royal Arch Degree is described as the "root and marrow" of Freemasonry. It's the climax of ancient craft Masonry and Masonic Symbolism. This might

surprise you as it's also the completion of the Master Mason Degree. I want you to think back to the time when you were raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason, what did you receive? If you said, "More Light" you are right. As a Royal Arch Mason, you will find the greatest treasure of a Freemason, the long lost "Masters Word". To become а Companion, you must travel a rough and rugged path, learning lessons along the way and rejoicing as the long lost, ancient Master's Word is finally discovered and realized. This real "Word" is to be communicated only in a Royal Arch Chapter. The ceremony in which a Master Mason is advanced to a Companion is called Exaltation. Upon your Exaltation as a Royal Arch Mason, you will become a member of the oldest and largest rite of Freemasonry. The York Rite which has three primary bodies, a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, a Council of Royal and Select Masters or Cryptic Masons, and the Commandery of Knights Templar. I couldn't help but hear some of our brothers mentioning the Knights Templar. If any of you have thoughts of becoming a member, you must first travel that rough and rugged path and become a Royal Arch Mason. After hearing all of this, why then should you consider becoming a Royal Arch Mason? The number one reason: So, you can continue your voyage of discovery. And number two, because the Royal Arch has so much to offer. In it, you will gain firsthand experience in the mysteries, all unfolded, as you participate in its Mystic Degrees. By receiving more

Masonic Light as a Royal Arch Mason it will cement your understanding and appreciation of what it truly means to be a Master Mason. I hope I speak for my fellow companions that this talk has given you some profound interest in becoming a fellow Royal Arch Mason."

Next, SK Jason Curtis "Jake" Trenary discussed (PDDGHP) how the superstructure of York Rite Freemasonry is built upon the foundations of the Blue Lodge, the additional moral maxims are taught in the Royal Arch Chapter Council Degrees, and the Cryptic Degrees are to prepare each man's heart and conscience for the chivalric character and obligations he will assume as a Christian Freemason in the knightly orders. He discussed a brief history of the early organization of the local Commandery in the city of Winchester and its part in the formation of the Grand Commandery of Virginia. He highlighted the life of the first Grand Commander, SK Daniel Walker Thomas.

SK Trenary also shared the different philanthropic endeavors of the Grand Commandery of Virginia and the Grand Encampment of the Knights Templar of the USA, including the Knights Templar Eye Foundation and the Holy Land Pilgrimage fund that supports two

Christian ministers annually who wish to travel to the Holy Land from Virginia. He discussed the fact that the Grand Commandery of Virgina had increased its membership in each of the last three years. Lastly, he stressed the universal importance of being the best Freemason in the room and that sharing the tenants of York Rite Freemasonry outside of the Lodge Room was essential to improving society the fabric of within the Community at large.


